Dear polio eradication supporter,

This month, leaders from around the world gathered at the Reaching the Last Mile Forum in Abu Dhabi to pledge an exceptional US\$ 2.6 billion to help fund the 2019-2023 Polio Endgame Strategy. The generous funds raised will not only help overcome challenges to reach every last child with polio vaccines, but also strengthen vital infrastructure that supports other health needs today and in the future. The forum also provided an opportunity for GPEI leadership to reflect on recent milestones and discuss strategies to overcome the key remaining barriers to eradication.

#### 2.6 billion reasons to celebrate

Moderated by Dr Ujala Nayyar, a surveillance officer from Pakistan, the polio pledging moment at the RLM Forum featured support from all levels. Individuals, national governments and other donors all

came together to recommit to polio eradication. Major pledges included US\$ 160 million pledged by the host of the pledging moment His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi, US\$ 1.08 billion pledged from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and US\$ 150 million raised by Rotarians which will further vaccine delivery and disease surveillance efforts.
