



Dear polio eradication supporter,

Last year, the WHO African Region (AFRO) was certified free of wild poliovirus after decades of commitment from Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) partners, governments, donors and frontline polio workers, and four years without a case of wild polio in any of the Region’s 47 countries. However, ongoing outbreaks of [circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus \(cVDPV\)](#) continue to persist in under-immunized communities.

On the first anniversary of WHO AFRO wild polio-free certification on 25 August 2021 and during the 71st WHO Regional Committee for Africa, WHO AFRO will be hosting a side event for health ministers from African countries to reaffirm their support for ending all forms of poliovirus in Africa. The GPEI has the [tools](#) and the [strategy](#) to stop these outbreaks before they begin – and with leaders’ renewed commitments – we can end polio in Africa once and for all.

Polio network slows COVID-19 spread in Kenya

Facing the threat of the rapid spread of COVID-19 in Nairobi’s slums, Kenya turned to its polio volunteers and their expertise in fighting disease. Leaning on years of experience building relationships and navigating hard-to-access areas to

UNICEF is very grateful to **CDC** for their generous contribution of US\$ 23 000 which will support UNICEF's global polio eradication activities.

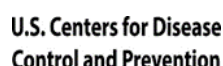
